Characterize the Yucca Mountain biota for possible use in an environmental impact statement

TERRESTRIAL ECOSYSTEM PROGRAM CONSISTS OF 5 COMPONENTS

- Biological Surveys
- Reclamation
- Desert Tortoise
- Site Characterization Effects Studies
- Support/Radiological Monitoring

Terrestrial Ecosystems Program is an integrated program. Information and personnel are shared among the various components within the program.

- Vegetation data from the Site Characterization Effects Studies provide basic information on cover, density, production, species diversity that can be used in assessing reclamation success
- Desert tortoise food studies have identified plant species that may be used in the reclamation program
- Pre-activity surveys have located tortoises that were radiomarked and used in desert tortoise studies

Terrestrial Ecosystems Program integrates with the other Yucca Mountain project environmental program and construction activities

Example; YAP30-2 Land Access and Environmental Compliance

- Pre-activity surveys
- Development of interim reclamation stipulations
- Monitoring of tortoises during site clearing
- Coordination with construction crews for topsoil removal and storage
- Post activity surveys
