# STATUS OF DRAFT PROPOSED NRC REGULATIONS FOR THE DISPOSAL OF HIGH-LEVEL RADIOACTIVE WASTES IN A PROPOSED GEOLOGIC REPOSITORY AT YUCCA MOUNTAIN



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## STAFF ACTIVITIES PRECEDING DEVELOPMENT OF SITE-SPECIFIC IMPLEMENTING REGULATIONS FOR YUCCA MOUNTAIN (10 CFR PART 63)

- Interactions with EPA on the development of protective and scientifically demonstrable standards for Yucca Mountain
- Extensive experience gained from conducting performance assessments (PAs) and reviewing DOE's PAs applicable to development of sitespecific, performance-based regulations
- Staff proposed strategy (SECY-97-300) for developing regulations in December 1997, Commission approved in March 1998

### WHY PROCEED WITH 10 CFR PART 63 NOW?

- EnPA requires NRC to conform its technical requirements to final EPA
   Yucca Mountain standards within one year of their issuance
  - NRC staff must develop its rule in parallel with EPA standards development
  - although Staff may not know all details of EPA's final standards at this time, NAS recommendations have been available for 3 years
- NRC has refocused its HLW program on those issues most important to performance.
  - tie to specific regulatory requirements important to continuing the focusing effort on those aspects that are most important
- NRC will modify part 63 to be consistent with Final EPA standards

#### **STATUS**

- Commission approved making proposed draft publicly available on web site (<a href="http://techconf.llnl.gov/cgi-bin/topics">http://techconf.llnl.gov/cgi-bin/topics</a>) - October 7, 1998
- Commission approved release of proposed 10 CFR Part 63 for public comment (January 12, 1999)
- Anticipate publication of proposed rule in Federal Register in early February
- Facilitate review and comment on proposed rule via public outreach program (tentatively for March 1999)
- Incorporate public comments and complete final 10 CFR Part 63 by fall of 1999
